## Blessings: The Good and The Bad

The story of the rebellious prophet Jonah shows us how God desires to use both blessings and trials to challenge us and change us for the better. Five times in the book of Jonah it says that the Lord prepared circumstances for him—both good and bad.

In Jonah 1:4 we read that the Lord sent a storm. It says He "sent out a great wind on the sea, and there was a mighty tempest on the sea." After the mariners discovered that Jonah was the reason for this storm, they threw him overboard (1:15). Then God "prepared a great fish to swallow Jonah" to save him from drowning (1:17).

Later in the book we read the "the Lord God prepared a plant" to shade Jonah (4:6). Then we see that God prepared a worm to kill the vine as well as a scorching wind and sun to beat down upon him (4:7-9). These circumstances were used to reveal Jonah's rebellious attitude. Only after that revelation could God directly confront Jonah's heart problem.

As we face different situations, we should remember that God is sovereign over both the blessings and the troubles that come our way. He desires to use everything to build our character (James 1:1-5). He uses both good and bad to transform us and guide us on our journey.

### **Assurance In God's Word**

Many times when we face opposition or trials in life we tend to weaken under the pressure. However, God has given us assurance through His written Word that He is with us.

When I first became a Christian, it seemed new challenges or obstacles loomed before me every day. It was then that I began to diligently search the Word of God to find answers for not only my problems, but also how to live an overcoming life. The following verses became my strength and my lifelong favorite passage! Read and claim these powerful words for yourself.

"Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written, For thy sake we are killed all the day long; we are accounted as sheep for the slaughter. Nay, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him that loved us. For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:35-39).

Notice that an entire category of troubles and sorrows are not ignored so that we can be assured of the love and mercy of God in all situations. I think often of an old hymn that says, "On Christ, the solid Rock I stand; all other ground is sinking sand." No one can give us a personal promise like our Lord can!

We all experience hardship, and trials can shake us unless we cling to truth. Let me share three assurances to remember when troublesome circumstances arise.

First, God will always meet our needs. This doesn't mean He provides everything we want. Instead, the Lord will bless us with all that is necessary to fulfill His purpose for our lives. His goal is to sanctify us, not simply to satisfy each immediate desire. Second, we're never alone. God promised to be with us always (Hebrews 13:5). There may be times when we feel deserted or opposed by family and friends. God gave us a very special promise in John 14:18, "I will not leave you comfortless: I will come to you." He is all we need - our Guide and our Comforter. Recognizing His presence gives us confidence in the midst of trials. Third, God's love is everlasting and His mercies are new every morning. He is the King of kings and the Lord of lords (I Timothy 6:15b). He knows the end from the beginning.

Read and claim this special promise in I Corinthians 10:13, "There hath no temptation [nor obstacle] taken you but such as is common to man: but God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that ye may be able to bear it.

It is of the LORD's mercies that we are not consumed, because his compassions fail not. They are new every morning: great is thy faithfulness. The LORD is my portion, saith my soul; therefore will I hope in him" (Lam. 3:22-24).

On Christ the solid Rock I stand!
